

We also tackled some bigger jobs that day. Mr Rey's rotted TJ frame got some McLovin from the BSJ crew







This obviously wasn't the final product - we plated 3 sides and all seams were welded nice and purdy

Crawling For A Cure 2014 Year-in-Review

Crawling For A Cure; On the Trail for Breast Cancer Research and Survivors was founded in early 2012. In October of 2013, we had our 1st Annual Event at the Backwoods Farm in Rumney, NH. With the support of the off-road community, we were able to donate a total of \$5,000 to the Dana Farber Cancer Institute and The Pink Angels, Inc.. In late 2013, we also became an officially registered charity in the State of Massachusetts.

Crawling For A Cure (CFAC) is organized entirely by volunteers with the mission to support breast cancer patients by contributing financially to their survivorship and to help fund research to cure breast cancer. In 2014, CFAC once again had informational vendor booths at numerous New England-area events including Go Topless Days in Rumney, NH and Monson, MA, the Ocean State Jeepster Festival in Kingston, RI and the perennial favorite: the Great American Jeep Rally in Ellington, CT. It's amazing to see the year-on-year growth at each of these events and we thank our hosts for having us and for supporting CFAC!

This past October, we held our own 2nd Annual Crawling For A Cure events. The first event was held at the Backwoods Farm on a rainy October 4th, but that didn't stop people from all over New England from coming out and showing their support. We are very grateful that the Backwoods Farm hosted us again, since literally, the day before the event they had a fire that destroyed their home. Tom and Lisa Lord were adamant that our event proceed as planned, so people were treated to a good time on Muddy Road (the 150' mud pit), moderate trails on the property, and lots of raffle prizes. One of the standouts that day was a visit from NH State Senator Jeanie Forrester- she took not one, but several rides through the Muddy Road as well as a trail ride courtesy of our fans! She was an incredibly good sport and was quite muddy when she left!



Our second event was held at the Quaboag Riders M/C's land in Monson MA on October 18th. Thankfully, it was a warm, sunny day and we were again graced by people from all over New England as well as a few folks that took the drive form NY and NJ. The East Coast Off-Road Jeepers of Connecticut did a great job organizing the trail rides and the Ocean State Jeepsters provided great logistical support! In addition, the Quaboag Riders M/C graciously arranged for demonstration climbs of the Monson Monster- these were a huge hit! This event also had a nice variety of raffle prizes with a lot of people going home with some great new gear as well as a few winning a weekend of wheeling at the Maine Warrior Salute next August!





In total, CFAC had about 250 vehicles enter the gates and over 350 people in attendance our two events in 2014! As we enter December, we are pleased to announce we have made a donation of \$3,500 each to both The Pink Angels, Inc. and to the Dana Farber Cancer Institute's Susan F. Smith Breast Cancer Center. Thanks to your support, CFAC donated a total of \$7,000 in 2014!! This is an incredible \$2,000 more than our donation of \$5,000 in 2013 and we simply could not have done it without you! As always, we are overwhelmed by your generosity, touched by the personal stories that you share with us, and delighted to visit with you at our events. We would like to offer a special thanks to Steve's Jeep Country for their generous donation of a winch for the NH event and Superwinch, LLC of CT for donating a winch for the MA event as well as all of the generous support from our assorted ongoing vendors like Elias 4WD Center and Black Widow Customs.

We have already established dates for our 2015 Crawling For A Cure events: we will be back at the Backwoods Farm on October 3rd and at the Quaboag Riders M/C land on October 17th! A special thank you to the Backwoods Farm and the Quaboag Riders M/C for opening their homes and land to us- your support means the world to us! Quick update for 2015:

In mid-February CFAC was approached by the Pacific Northwest Four Wheel Drive Association, Trail Jamboree which is a jeep event in Washington State. This is their 26th year, and they will host approximately 400-500 guests and 150 jeeps fromJuly 8-12. The exchange that ensued quickly evolved into a new program for Crawling For A Cure: the Trail Ride Program.

This program is simple, interested parties are sent an application, once they are vetted, we sign an agreement. The basics are; in exchange for hosting the run and having a guests sign a waiver we will provide them with a trail ride sticker and offer the option of shipping them swag and promotional material as well as an official letter of support to help in dealing with local vendors and other organizations. We ask the host to select a local Breast Cancer patient and survivor charity. We split the proceeds of the run after expenses with the local charity to help keep local money local and send a CFAC check in the hosts name to the locally chosen patient organization and the other half of the money is sent to a National foundation doing breast cancer research in October.

Since the inception of the program we have had interest in hosting other events in Folsom CA, Phoenix AZ, Upstate NY, and RI and we really have not launched the program yet! The official launch of the first CFAC Trail ride will be in Monson MA at Ocean State Jeepsters Go Topless Day! We will have two trail rides to benefit CFAC and officially launch the program! Stay tuned to our website and Facebook page (nearing 1,800 likes as of this writing) for more exciting updates and new trail rides as they are announced!
