The day started off overcast and windy but once we got on the trail the wind seemed to die down and the sun came out allowing me to take the windows off of my soft top.

We aired down at the club house because they didn't want us to overwhelm the fire road at the trail head. We left for the trails in two waves. The first one being the rigs on trailers and the second for the rigs that drove there.



Once we got to the trail head we were greeted by the "filter." It was a loose rocky climb that eventually gave way to rolling granite. From there everyone made their way to a meeting spot on top a clear piece of granite. If I had to guess there was 30 rigs and they all varied from almost stock to full rock crawlers. Two rigs had to be escorted out because they couldn't go on; the clutch was burning up on one rig and the other's front u-joints were toast. From there we broke up in



to 4 groups. The group I ended up in had 6 rigs, 3 from Mass Mudders (a Nissan, Cherokee and JKU), one from East Coast Jeepers of Connecticut (2-door JK), me (2-door JK) and Toyota Highlander (don't know which club he was a part of),

As far as the trails go, they were tight with tons of rolling granite and trees with a bunch of offshoots with a ton of crawling obstacles to play on if you wanted to. We ended up being on the trails for almost 5 hours and only hit about 1/3 of the main trails. The trails were super clean and well maintained you can tell that the local club have gone out of their way to upkeep the property and maintain it.
